

The true story of Sir Nicholas 'Nicky' Winton, a young London broker who visited Prague in December 1938. He found families who had fled the rise of the Nazis in Germany and Austria, living in desperate conditions under threat of Nazi invasion. How many children could he and the team rescue before the borders closed? Fifty years later, Nicky is still blaming himself for not doing more. It's not until a live BBC television show, 'That's Life', surprises him by introducing him to some surviving children - now adults - that he finally begins to come to terms with the guilt and grief he had carried for five decades. Runtime: 110 mins

The Fincham Memorial Hall and its community volunteers have an exciting lineup of events scheduled for the hopefully warmer summer months, promising a blend of entertainment, films, bingo, history, quizzes, choirs and our annual Fete.

Starting with a series of **Quiz Nights**, the first on **May 3rd**, then on **June 7th**, and another on July 5th, these evenings offer a chance for community members to gather, compete, and enjoy their own refreshments in a relaxed atmosphere. The June screening is "The Holdovers" which is described as a consistently smart, funny movie about people who are easy to root for, while the July screening tells the poignant true story of Sir Nicholas Winton in "One Life." Films start at 7:15 PM, and attendees can enjoy a licensed bar and snacks.

Theatre lovers have the opportunity to witness major productions from the National Theatre on their doorstep on May 24th with the excellent The Motive and the Cue. We carry on with the National Theatre on June 15th with Michael Sheen in a powerful portrayal of Nye Bevan. Both events also feature a licensed bar and start at 7:15 PM. We are still waiting to hear what play will be shown in July, as soon as we know, it will be on our website https://finchammemorialhall.org/ where you can also book tickets in advance.

For those who enjoy games, Cash Bingo nights on May 17th, June 21st and July 19th offer a chance to play without an entry fee; participants only pay for the games they play, starting at 8:00 PM. Our numbers are growing, and with them the prizes, so do come along early to get a seat.

A special highlight of the summer calendar is the **Fincham Chorus Concert** on **June 29** at 7:30 PM. This concert showcases local vocal talent in a celebratory musical evening.

Our annual **Fincham Fete** on **June 1st** is an all-day event packed with activities, including performances by the Marham Military Wives Choir, a mini fairground, and a classic car display, offering something for every age and interest and includes many refreshment options.

Our **thanks to Chrissy Burnett** who has taken over looking after the garden in front of the hall.

Finally, we are in touch with the architect, to draw up the plans for the hall, based on all of your input. We will be sharing these with you, via another consultation event at the hall, as soon as we can.

These events not only provide entertainment for you - the residents of the village - but also support the upkeep of the local memorial hall, we hope you enjoy the events - please do come and join us.
